Benefits provided

The co-production of a new and innovative way of providing high quality, locally grown, organic and seasonal produce to food-insecure households, and ensuring they have the information, skills, ingredients and confidence needed to use them effectively.

Impacts and outcomes

Project kick off event at West Gate Gallery and Coffee Shop, attended by 18 people from a range of different organisations. Contribution from Professor Angelina Sanderson Bellamy of the University of West England highlighted the important role we can play connecting growers / farmers to community groups to facilitate the provision of vegetable boxes and create positive connections between growers and customers.

Highlights

Prof Bellamy's research was really insightful in terms of helping us to understand how Pobl Tir Môr can add value to the food system by helping to develop relationships between food producers and groups supporting people within the community.

It has helped us realise we can play a very useful role in bringing people together and developing our relationship with the VC Gallery to think about how we can support them to develop their growing activities in Pembroke Dock.
